

CAVE OF GOLD has never been published by the Piobaireachd Society, but by Peter Henderson in 1926 for a collector called G.F. Ross who lived in India and produced two books on Piobaireachd. The first one was called some Piobaireachd studies and was what he called, "A correction of mutulated tunes". The second book was published in 1929 and called a collection of McCrimmon and other Piobaireachd, but most of the information came from Thomason's mss. and Simon Fraser of Australia. Simon Fraser had been taught by Peter Bruce who was taught by the last of the McCrimmons. These books produced nothing new, what did happen was that Peter Henderson lost money and the book was ignored.
