





POLICE PIPER BECOMES AN AMBASSADOR FOR THE PIOBAIREACHD:

(from Oban Times, July 18, 1964) Glasgow Letter

The Glasgow City Police pipe Band, famed throughout the world, is going on an American tour early in September and it is appropriate therefore, that on the eve of their departure, I should write something about the Highlander who is responsible to the chief constable for the welfare and conduct of the band. So.... May I introduce

Pipe Major Angus Macdonald, the eldest son of Mr. Lachlan Macdonald and the late Mary Macdonald, Baleshare, North Uist, owes his early tuition on the piob mhor to two brothers, Mr. John Maclean, Carinish, and Mr. Donald Maclean, now headmaster of Staffin J.S. School Skye.

Angus was only 17 years old when the last war broke out but being a member of the 4th Camerons T.A., he was mobilised right away and shortly afterwards posted to the 5th Camerons at their depot at Inverness. Too young to go to France, he was given the opportunity of joining the regimental pipe band and came under the influence of that able pipe major the late William Young who was in charge at that time.

Angus remained a member of the depot band until November, 1940, when he was selected by Major General D.M. Wimberley to be his personal piper and escort at Headquarters 51st (H) Division.

In 1942 the division was ordered to the Middle East and of course Angus went with them and in the months that followed took part in the battle of El Alamein and the subsequent campaign in North Africa and Sicily. When the battalion returned to the U.K. the following year, Mr. Macdonald, who was pipe-sergeant by this time, was given a short respite and attended at the Army School of Piping in Edinburgh under Pipe Major William Ross.

Into harness again in 1944, he took part in the Normandy landings and was one of the pipers who led the 51st Division back into St. Valery, where the original 51st had been forced, with such drastic consequences, to surrender in 1940.

Prior to the cessation of hostilities he was promoted pipe major and left the Servies in 1946 carrying this rank. After a short period as a prison officer, he joined the City of Glasgow Police Force and was, of course, a "natural" for the pipe band where his organising ability and powers of leadership were soon noted.

He took over as pipe major from John Macdonald when the latter retired in 1958 and in the interval has had to work immensely hard to bring the band, which had suffered from retirals and lack of proper recruits, back to scratch.

The band, since that time, has been practically re-formed, for 21 members have been recruited to its ranks and from all the reports and the results attained it is obvious it is again climbing to the crest of the wave.

Members of the band have already this year travelled extensively and as well as appearing at a Royal Command performance in Denmark, have visited France on two occasions. Pipe Major Macdonald is certainly a kenspeckle figure on the Continent for he recently took part in a programme on Austrian television and has twice visited Switzerland at the invitation of the British Council and the British Travel Association to boost tourism to Scotland.

It is worthy of note that in 1961, Angus had the honour of being the only solo piper ever to be invited to take part in a Royal Command performance.

Among his extra mural activities are his interests with the Uist and Barra Association with which he has served as a committee member, piping convener and secretary. His wife, Elizabeth Reid, formerly of Innisfail, Alberta, and of Elgin, is an officer in the public health department of this city and I hope they have a pleasant holiday with their two children prior to Angus's departure across the water.


HE PLAYED FOR QUEEN'S GREAT-GRANDFATHER: (from Oban Times, July 2, 1964)

Among those invited to meet Her Majesty the Queen when she lunched last week at Skibo Castle with Mrs. Carnegie Miller, was Mr. Angus Macpherson, who lived on the Shin (Sutherland) and is so well known in the piping world, and also as the author of the book "A Highlander Looks Back".

On presenting Mr. Angus Macpherson, who is in his 80's, to Her Majesty, Mrs. Miller told the Queen that he was friend and piper of old to her family. She told the Queen that Angus Macpherson had piped a welcome to Her Majesty's great grandfather, King Edward VII, when he visited Skibo in the year 1902.

Mrs. Miller told the Queen that she (Mrs. Carnegie Miller) and Mr. Angus Macpherson were the only two remaining of those who took part in that ceremony of long ago.

The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh were much interested and they asked Angus Macpherson if he was still judging the piping at the Braemar Gathering.


