2. During the competition there will be one piper playing, one inside the door, and one outside the door tuned and ready to step inside.

PROMOTIONS FOR THE 1974 SEASON

Due to many circumstances, the 20-point promotional system proved impractical this year. The Board of Directors has decided to review the promotions after every season and deal with each class accordingly.

Because of incomplete results from Portland and Seattle, pipers are reminded of the point ceiling in each of the classes and are expected to promote themselves into the next class.

The points were taken from the following competitions: Vancouver Ladies' Festival, B.C. Pipers' Indoor Meet, New Westminster, Victoria, B.C. Highland, Nanaimo, Portland, and Seattle.
