LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

July 23, 1983

I suppose that for many of us, the sole reason for involvement in anything is to be the best. Of course in piping, being the best means hard work, talent, and from time to time, luck. There is one further component, which seems to be the subject of much discussion these days, and that is judging. For some unfortunate reason, the performance of a solo piper, or of a pipe band, seems to be more often equated with an athletic competition, than a musical expression. The emphasis is on winning, not necessarily on playing well.

The competitive scene has certainly done a great deal to bring out the best in many individual players and bands, but I would also say a great deal of damage has been done to younger players who become frustrated at not winning. Theexamples set by many of the top competitors and bands is not exactly a sterling one for these younger players either. After all, winning isn't everything, it's the only thing. That mentality seems to prevail amongst many of us when we don't win, or don't feel that we were given a fair shot by the judges on the day.

None of us can say that we haven't felt a time or two that a judge's decision wasn't right. I have taken part on several occassions in conversations after band competitions with band members, where the topic of the conversation was the results of the day. This is both understandable, and to my way of thinking, excusable. We are out to do our best, just like the other bands. I recently witnessed something after a competition which I felt was inexcusable. Some members of different bands were openly confronting a judge, obviously dissatisfied with the results for the day.

This regretable situation was embarassing, and brought into my view for the first time just how competitive the piping scene has gotten. I feel extremely fortunate to be playing with a Grade 1 band, that plays against two of the best pipe bands in the world. As a result of my participation, I have come to know many fine individuals in all of these bands. But when competition gets to the point where we don't speak to one another after competitions, or feel it is necessary to confront judges, I say the situation needs to be carefully evaluated. I would certainly hope that I could always congratulate a competitor who puts in a good performance, and appreciate the level of talent and musicianship required to compete and win in a piping competition in this area. I would also hope that I could listen to a piper or a band play, and enjoy a performance from a musical perspective, and not based on how the results turned out.

The Banner contest for Piobaireachd is an annual contest held during the Spokane Piobaireachd Societies' piping school at Coeur d'Alene. The contest is an invitational open contest, the prize being \$500. and a very attractive pipe banner plus a lot of prestige.

The Judge is usually the principal instructor at the school. This years principal instructor was Pipe Major Evan MacRae formerly of the Queen's Own Highlanders and a 1982 Gold Medalist. I would be remiss if I do not mention that P/M MacRae was a Cameron Highlander prior to the merger of the Seaforth-Camerons in 1965 at which time I was a Seaforth (Canada).

I considered it a great honor, which became a great pleasure when Pipe Major MacRae asked me to sit with him during the 14 Piobaireachds that were played that day.

Although there was only one winner, there were several good tunes played somewhat marred by pipes going off tune or memory lapses from the competitors. Pipe Major MacRae and myself both agreed that interpretations of Battles, Laments, Gatherings, etc. were base criteria for criticism. Failure to stay with the theme of the ground of a Piobaireachd was evident in a couple of instances.

Before I get into the Piobaireachd results each competitor plays a 2/4 March for a \$50. prize and a very suitably engraved portrait of Colonel John McEwing, late, founder of the Spokane Piobaireachd Society. The winner of this event was Colin Gemmell of Spokane, Washington with a very nice rendition of "Donald MacLeans Farewell to Oban".

The winning Piobaireachd was played by Hal Senyk with a very nicely played "King's Taxes" on a well-tuned, well-balanced set of pipes. Hal projected confidence throughout his performance and seemed to be enjoying what he was doing. Runner-up was Alan Walters from Prince George, B.C. with a very good performance of "Patrick Og MacCrimmon's Lament". Unfortunately his drones went out of tune near the end and cost him further consideration. Another performance that rated honorable mention was by Jill Laurie with "Lament for the Viscount of Dundee". Her Piobaireachd was nicely played and certainly woth consideration as well.

It was certainly a great experience for me to be part of the act and my best wishes and congratulations go out to all the competitors who participated and made it a very fine day for all who attended.

EDITORIAL


