



How many times over the last few months have you asked yourself, "What ever heppened to the B.C. Pipers' Newsletter"? We know many of you have missed our monthly publication and hope you all have been somewhat concerned. Well, after almost a year we are in business again.

Before proceeding any further, on behalf of the Directors of the Association we would like to extend our apologies for the lack of publication and at the same time extend our most sincere appreciation to Messrs. Ian Walker, William McAdie, Donald Urquhart and Ken McIlvena for their superb efforts in producing the Newsletter over the last eight years.

As many of you remember, the first edition was printed in April, 1960 as a three page notice. The Newsletter increased in size as the months went by and in April, 1961 a new format was introduced in the form of a magazine. By this time the magazine was a full scale publication and the circulation grew to over 400 reaching as far as Alaska, Australia and Scotland.

During the entire eight years of publication Mr. Walker has been the editor and inspiration of the Newsletter while Messrs. McAdie, McIlvena and Urquhart put in many long evenings printing and circulating the finished products. Unfortunately these members have been forced to discontinue their active participation due to family, business and other social obligations. WE OF THE ASSOCIATION ARE DEEPLY GRATEFUL FOR THEIR ENDEAVOURS. When we attempted to continue producing a Newsletter that would come anywhere near duplicating the previous high standard, their talents were more fully appreciated.

Since edition number 87 (February-March, 1968) there has been no Newsletter. The Directors of the Association gave serious consideration to this fact but the problems and responsibilities seemed to be more than anyone wanted to handle. Finally it was decided to start anew with two or three pages.

The purpose of the Newsletter is more than to serve as an entertaining magazine. For many members it is the only communication link with the Association. Unfortunately, without the Newsletter, those interested in attending meetings, bi-monthly competitions and social gatherings are not aware of these events. With the continued publication, a more active interest in the B.C. Pipers' Association is anticipated and the prospect of seeing more of our members at Association functions is forseen.

Hopefully the Newsletter will develop and grow to the fine magazine it once was. Until that time we are depending on your patience and <u>HELP</u>.
