## ANNUAL GATHERING

The 50th edition of the B.C. Pipers' Annual Gather.. ing will be held on Friday, April 9 th and Saturday, April Vancouve arince of Wales Secondary School, 2250 EDOINGTON,

The judges for this year include Mr. R.G. Hardie from Glasgow, Scotland and Mr. Bill Livingston, Whitby, Ontario. Bob Hardie will be familiar to most people as the famous bagpipe maker and Pipe Major of Muirhead and Sons Pipe Band, as well as an excellent solo player in his earlier years. Bill Livingston has just returned from Scotland as the Clasp winner at the Northern Meeting in Inverness. He is also Pipe Major of the highly enterw taining General Motors Pipe Band, a member of the Grade One circuit in eastern Canada.

Some features of this years indoor meet include the addition of a chanter class, juvenile piobaireachd (ground and one variation), solo drumming and Grade IV Mini Bands. There will also be two categories of Junior Quartettes - 15 years and under and 16 years to 18.

All amateur piping; that is chanter, navice, juvenile, junior, and senior will be held on Friday. The junior and senior quartettes as well as the drumming events will take place on Friday evening. Professional piping events are scheduled for all day Saturday with all grades of mini bands set for Saturday evening. Approxi.. mate times for all events will be published in the next edition of the newsletter.

Following the band competition and prize giving ceremony, a céilidh will be held in the cafeteria featur. ing the Crofters. Aggregate winners in all classes will also be invited to play a small selection.

Partial kitchen facilities will be available in the cafeteria, meaning light lunches and snacks. If any band is interested in running the kitchen for their own profit please contact Jim MacDonald at 941-8057, no later than March 26th. In the event that two or more bands apply, then a draw will be held.

As most of you have no doubt noticed the various indoor contests, Triumph Street, Vancouver Ladies, and the B.C. Pipers seem to be held in a different location each year. One major reason for this rather puzzling situation is that we're forever being "booted out" of these halls after we hold our competitions. Venues such as st. Francis De Sales School, S.F.U., and Guildford Park

School are no longer available to us, mainly due to damage caused during our functions. If you have been involved in trying to secure a hall for a contest you know how difficult it has become. In other words "DON'T MESS UP THIS ONE" or very shortly the Annual Gathering will be known as the "outdoor meet". To this end, each Pipe Major and Instructor will be allocated a tuning room and will be responsible for that room until the competition. Any costs incurred due to damage will be accountable to the Pipe Major or Teacher.
