

Dear Sirs,

I am writing this to thank you and your contest committee for inviting me to adjudicate at your second annual trio and miniature band contest.

I was pleased to meet both old and new acquaintances and I also have to say, I was very much impressed with the standard of piping, both in the trio and the band contest and I also enjoyed the selection of tunes that were played. I couldn't help noticing also, the high standard of drumming.

Congratulations are in order to the contest committee and people who helped out in conducting a very nicely run contest and I do like the idea of everything taking place in the afternoon. Short and sweet as we say, although, I am aware of the time and effort involved in the organizing of such an event.

I did have a small regret, and that was that I didn't change my judging position, after the trios, to the stage end of the hall, so that I didn't have the drum sections between me and the pipe sections. I found it tough to judge the finer fingering, execution points, because of my position, especially when pipes and drums are playing together "indoors".

Having judged the first band from centre of the hall position, I decided it wouldn't be fair to change for the other bands.

In situations like this, if you supply the judge with a clip board, he or they can move around the band, staying away the minimum of six feet from any bandsman.

Please don't think I am complaining. On the contrary, I loved every minute of it. I heard at least three bands for the first time, including Triumph Street, and although you had trouble getting the pipes set up on that particular day, the playing was very good and I certainly see excellent potential in your band.

The Victoria boys had a good day and impressed me with good playing and excellent set up pipes, drones and chanters. Of course, Port Moody played well too, but didn't produce the clear crisp tone that I enjoyed from the Victoria band. For the three bands I have just mentioned, I can't help noticing the Pipe Majors are all fairly young men, doing a great job.

The Vancouver Ladies, always pleasant to watch and listen to, what can I say except they are playing well against tough opposition and are certainly an asset to senior competition bands.

C.P. Air Senior are tops in their class and seem to be consistent as I heard them, also playing well, at Santa Rosa last September.

I was also pleased to hear the Portland Ladies give a good rendition, except for one big boob when most of the pipers cut out. "Ladies", you have to memorize those tunes.

I hope my comments on the points sheets of the other Junior bands will help a bit (C.P. Air Junior and White Spot).

Before concluding, I must say how much I also enjoyed the trio piping, especially the seniors. I truly heard some beautiful sounding pipes and very, very good playing of nice tunes.

Congratulations to the winners, and I say there are no losers in our piping and drumming business; just those who have to practice a little more than the winners. "Wishing is not enough."

This year's chief adjudicator is Mr. Iain MacFadyen of Wester Ross.

As well as the usual duties associated with the position, Mr. MacFadyen will also be faced with the task of selecting an amateur and professional piper to represent British Columbia at the City of Ottawa Highland Games.

The representatives will be the aggregrate winners of the Senior Amateur and Open events provided, of course, they are residents of B. C.

All novice, juvenile and junior events, also short leets for amateur piobaireachd, will be played on Friday, March 29, 1974.

Rules:

Individual and Quartette competitions:

Pipers not ready to play when called are LIABLE TO BE DISQUALIFIED.

A piper will be allowed to play in one quartette only.

Junior Bands will consist of Pipers and Drummers, 18 years of age and under on January 1st of the current competition year.

Miniature Bands - 6 pipers; 2 sides, 1 bass drummer.

Bands will be penalized one twelfth (1/12th) of total points for each player less than the required number.

Each member must be a bona-fide member of this band for at least 14 days prior to competition.

A piper or drummer will be allowed to play in one band only.

Any band not ready to play five (5) minutes after completion of previous band will be deducted five (5) points.
