

Pipers not ready to play when called are LIABLE TO BE DISQUALIFIED

A piper will be allowed to play in one quartette only.

Junior Bands will consist of Pipers & Drummers, 18 years of age and under on January 1st. of the current competition year.

Miniature Bands - 6 pipers; 2 sides; 1 bass drummer; and 1 tenor drummer.

Bands will be penalized one twelfth (1/12) of total points for each player less than the required number.

Each member must be a bona-fide member of this band for at least 14 days prior to the competition.

A piper or drummer will be allowed to play in one band only.

Any band not ready to play five (5) minutes after completion of the pravious band will be deducted five (5) points.

There willbe no entry fee. Last to enter will be first to play. Order to play will be posted.

PIPING SCHOOL

A piping school is planned to coincide with the visit of P. M. Iain Morrison, 1st Batt. Queens Own Highlanders, who will be this years judge at the annual gathering. The school will run for 5 days under the auspices of the B. C. Pipers Association and will be held at the Seaforth Armouries Monday-Friday, 28th March-1st April, 9.30-4.30. Fees will be \$40 per pupil, if more than one pupil from the same family they will have a reduction of \$20 per additional pupil, it is to be hoped that a good number of pipers will take advantage of this chance to better their skills under one of the best pipers at the present time. P. M. Morrison has numerous prizes to his credit at all the major Competitions in Scotland and is especially strong in Strathspeys and Reels. Only pupils from Juvenile upwards will be accepted, as the board feels that pipers of a more advanced stage would gain the most benefit from a weeks tuition.

Dundee, Scotland

Of Interest to Professional Pipers.

We have had a meeting and formed a (Competing Pipers association) on 12th December. I am president and Hugh MacCallum is secretary. It was decided that 3 grades would operate for players: Premier; Grade 1; and Grade 2. An advisory committee of 12 members from different area's were elected, and will be responsible for grading the players. Oversea's players will be advised to enroll if intending a visit here to play at Oban or Inverness.

The committee will seek advice from oversea's players, and where members of the committee have heard and judged oversea's players this information can be used. At the moment, we are waiting to meet the northern meeting committee to decide what will happen this year. When I get more copies of the constitution I will mail one over. If any players in the West Coast are interested in joining at the moment, they could write to:

If for any reason Iain Morrison cannot attern the annual gathering as judge, due to army pressures taking precedence over his trip here, Jimmy MacIntosh has very kindly consented to judge in his place if need be, such an offer as this makes one proud to be a member of the piping fraternity.

On Monday January 17, 1977 the membership of the Association were saddened to hear of the passing of Rod MacRae, a Past President and Life member of the Association.

Rod joined the Association in the 1930's and took a very active part in the Association's work. In the early 1940's as President he changed the format of the Annual Gathering from a small one evening affair to the full day contest, this was the beginning of the Gathering as we know it today.

Rod was a member of the White Heather Committee from the early days and served as Chairman for many years until sickness in the family forced him to give it up.

He played with the 2nd. Battalion Seaforths during the war years and was a member of the Shrine Pipe Band from 1952 until his passing. He was active for many years in the Kiwanis Pipe Band and assisted them on their many trips and appearances.

We have two trophies in the Association today, one for the Annual Gathering and one for the Mini Competitions that bear his name.

We extend our condolences to Mrs. MacRae and family on this sad occasion.
