

RULES

Individual, Quartette and Band competitions

Pipers not ready to play when called are LIABLE TO BE DISQUALIFIED.

A piper will be allowed to play in one quartette only.

Junior Bands will consist of Pipers & Drummers, 18 years of age and under on January 1st, of the current competition year.

Miniature Bands - 6 pipers; 2 sides; 1 bass drummer; and 1 tenor drummer.

Bands will be penalized one twelfth (1/12) of total points for each player less than the required amount.

Each member must be a bona-fide member of this band for at least 14 days prior to the competition.

A piper or drummer will be allowed to play in one band only.

Any band not ready to play five (5) minutes after completion of the previous band will be deducted five (5) points.

Last to enter will be first to play. Order to play will be posted.

PIPING AND DRUMMING RULES

Piping - All piping events are covered by the revised B.C. Pipers rules. Novices may play a two-part tune twice over, or a four-part tune once over.

Drumming - A 2/4 march is required. A two-part tune may be played twice over, or a four-part tune once over. Drummers must provide their own piper. If not already entered in the meet, such pipers will be admitted free of charge provided they are in costume and their name has been submitted on the drummer's entry form.

Entry Fees - \$1.50 each event to accompany entry form. \$3.00 each quartette to accompany entry form. 50¢ for competitor number to accompany entry form, refundable when number is returned.

Absolutely no entries accepted by telephone or on day fo meet.

NOVICE TENOR: One who has never won 1st, 2nd or 3rd in any competition.

JUNIOR TRIO: Competitors to be 18 years or under.

NOTE: ANY CLASS WITH LESS THAN 6 COMPETITORS MAY BE CANCELLED. COMPETITORS MUST BE ON HAND WHEN CALLED OR FACE DISQUALIFICATION.

This year the Ladies Pipe Band Festival features Open Professional Piping and Drumming for the first time. It is sincerely hoped that a good slate of Pipers and Drummers enter these events which offer excellent prize money.

NEWS FLASH!! This news comes via George Will, from a Seattle dancer, who was told by a lawyer, etc., etc., etc. If any of you have sealskin sporrans and you intend taking them across into the U.S. you may have them confiscated. This would also apply to returning U.S. residents examined by U.S. customs. Patti tried to find out more about this fact but, up until now, has gathered only the following. Under the Marine Mammals Act the carrying of sealskin or any other marine mammal skin into the U.S. is prohibited and the U.S. Customs officials advise that this is strictly enforced. Upon checking with them their advice is "leave your sporran at home" as it could be confiscated without even the opportunity of returning to Canadian Customs to leave it there. However, there may be a way out. Customs advise that a special dispensation may be obtained from the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Branch. A letter was written to this department to find out more about the whole matter and see if we can find a solution.

This could really throw a spanner into the works if not cleared up soon, on account of so much travel over the boarders by Pipers and Drummers from either country.
