He has taught at Coeur d'Alene, and anyone who has attended his classes can attest to his ability.

We are fortunate to have a Piobaireachd instructor of Andrew's calibre; he brings years of study with such teachers as Donald McLeod and Robert Nicol, and we would be wise to learn as much as we can from him.

Price of the school is the same as last year's - \$75., and \$50. each for family entries. Class sizes will be kept down as much as is economically feasible. Hours will run from approximately 8:30 - 4:00. Place to be determined, although we can guarantee it will be in the Lower Mainland. 
