

# BRIEF HISTORY OF THE ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION PIPE BAND - BRANCH 26 KELOWNA B. C.

- Possibly the oldest Legion Band in B. C., being formed in in 1923 by Sandy Mitchell and receiving Legion sponsorship in 1926 when the Legion began as a national organization.
- In the year 1930 uniforms were purchased for 9 Pipers and 6 Drummers. The present membership being 14 Pipers and 8 Drummers, wearing the Royal Stewart Tartan.
- The Band is well travelled in B. C. and Washington State participating in the Apple Blossom Festival in Wenachee in May is some what of a record -- 30 times. Other Washington Parades include Omak, Wintrop, Republic and B. C. Parades include Pentiction, Kelowna, Vernon, Ashcroft, Kamloops, Nakusp, Greenwood, Grand Forks, Falkland and Clinton.
- Although not recognised as a competing Band we have attended the Annual R. C. Legion Band Competitions twice, at Haney in 1974 and Abbotsford in 1976.
- Since 1950 the band has held an annual Dinner & Dance For Wives & Friends of Band members and also sponsors an annual tartan night dance to be held this year on Saturday June 11th.
- Highlights of recent years include playing at the 1968 MacDonalds Brier Curling Championship in Kelowna possibly our most important preformance for Queen Elizabeth, Prince Philipp and Princess Anne in Kelowna 1971 B. C.'s Centennial year.
- No history of the Kelowna Legion Pipe Band would be complete without mentioning the record of James Arthur, one of the first pipers trained in the Okanagan who joined the band in 1930 and has been a member for 47 years, 35 of which have been as Pipe Major. In 1972 James was honoured with a Life Membership in the band.

# GLENTRUIM SCHOOL OF PIPING NELSON B. C.

Once again we are organizing the Glentruim School of Piping, and looking forward to seeing old friends and new this summer. To let you know more about the School the following few paragraphs give an outline of the beginning of the school, the origin of the name, short sketches of our principal and instructors, and Notre Dame University of Nelson.

Glentruim School of Piping began with the renewal of longstanding friendships. While holidaying in Scotland in 1969 Bill Sutherland of Nelson got in touch with Pipe Major Donald MacLeod. Bill and Donald served together in the Seaforth Highlanders from 1938 until 1941 when Bill was injured and evacuated through Dunkirk. Donald was captured, but was soon to escape and make his way home to Britain through enemy territory.

In 1970 when Nelson's Own Kootenay Kiltie Pipe Band Association decided to start up a Piping School Donald MacLeod was our first choice. We began with 28 pupils instructed almost entirely by Donald with assistance from Bill Sutherland and Rab Douglas, also of Nelson. The second year of the school we had 40 pupils with Angus MacLeod and Bill Thomson joining the staff. The third year we had 50 pupils and were joined by Pipe-Major Edmund Esson, M. B. E.

The name Glentruim was chosen as this was the home of Pipe-Major John MacDonald, the great master player, and direct musical descendant of the MacCrimmons of Skye, who tutored Donald for 25 years.

PIPE-MAJOR DONALD MacLEOD possibly the greatest piper, teacher, and composer of modern times was born in Stornoway, Isle of Lewis and was first taught by his father at the age of four, and for five years was the pupil of the famous Willie Ross. Donald joined the Seaforth Highlanders and served with them for 25 years - 21 as Pipe-Major. Donald has not only won the Gold Medal and eight clasps at the Northern Meeting, but is a six time winner of the Silver Star for Marches, Strathspeys and Reels and is probably the only Piper ever to win all the events at the Northern Meeting at one time or another.

PIPE-MAJOR EDMUND ESSON, M. B. E. of Vancouver was Pipe-Major of the Seaforth Highlanders of Canada for many years and the Senior Pipe-Major in the Canadian Army. Ed is a man of many accomplishments too numerous to set out here. He has taught, recorded, judged, and promoted piping in British Columbia. As recently as last year Ed was President of the Seaforth Association to which he donated many hours of his time. Pipe-Major Edmund Esson is an excellent Piper and a fine example for young Pipers. We are happy to have him as an instructor.

PIPE-MAJOR ANGUS G. MacLEOD is a native of the Hebrides, and served with the 2nd Battalion, Seaforth Highlanders. Angus was taken prisoner at St. Valery and made his own chanter in prison camp, keeping up his piping. Angus came to Canada after the was and served with the Seaforth Highlanders of Canada in Vancouver. He has instructed in piping for the past fifteen years and now lives on Salt Spring Island. Angus is very popular with the youngsters and is a good Administrator.

PIPE\_MAJOR WILLIAM THOMSON served in the Imperial Army and took his piping training in Scotland. He has served as Pipe-Major of Nelson's Own Kootenay Kiltie Pipe Band and the Trail Pipe Band. Bill continues a school in Nelson through the winter months, his dedication to piping is an inspiration to all.

The School will run from SUNDAY, 21st AUGUST to FRIDAY, 2nd SEPTEMBER, 1977, and will be sponsored by Nelson's Own Kootenay Kiltie Pipe Band Association in conjuntion with Notre Dame University of Nelson. The fee will be \$250 for full-time students and \$150 for day-students.

This year we hope to limit the school to forty pupils in keeping with our policy of quality rather than quantity. As it will be on a "first come - first served" basis we suggest you submit your application no later than the 15th July, 1977.

Pupils are asked to bring Pipes, chanters, music, Highland dress for morning parade and outings, sleeping bag, sheets and pillow, changes of underwear and socks. Tape recorders are encourages if you have one at your disposal.
