

All players will be considered to be competitors ans subject to adjudication by their respective pipe band judges.

All competitors are to be attired in recognizable Highland ss and Davil wear at least a kilt, hose, flashes, sporran, and shees. Dress for bands is to be or a conforming nature.

Pipers are to tune pipes in the designated areas only - this rule applies equally to drummers.

Dear Members,

I would like first of all to thank the B. C. Pipers' Association for the invitation to judge at their 46th Annual Gathering.

Being met with a reception committee at the Airport was also very nice, being composed of James MacDonald, Jimmy MacMillan and none other than John Burgess, whom I haven't seen since 1952.

In the past I have never co-judged with anyone so it was a special pleasure on my visit here to have the company of P/M John Burgess for the job, on hand.

On looking back, I enjoyed the two days work immensly, although the judging was very tough, as there are so many good and potentially good pipers in the area. It is very obvious that there are First Class teachers around.

I have nothing but praise for the way the competition was organized thanks mainly to a first class committee headed by Donald Ross. I realize there must be one or two snags in a piping competition this size, but as a judge none were apparent to me.

The accoustics for pipes were very good in the small rooms, and also in the lage hall, but it was a different story with the band contest where we had drums and pipes clashing. I don't know what could be done about it, other than the use of a temporary carpet for the band competition. Having had the same problem when I played with the Powell River Pipe Band, and the use of a floor covering produced a much cleaner sound.

In conclusion I with to thank everyone who made my stay so welcome, and special thanks to Teresa and Willie McErlean for their generous hospitality.
