In the past I have never co－judged with anyone so it was． a special pleasure on my visit here to have the company of P／M John Burgess for the job，on hand．

On looking back，I enjoyed the two days work immensly， although the judging was very tough，as there are so many good and potentially good pipers in the area．It is very obvious that there are First Class teachers around．

I have nothing but praise for the way the competition was organized thanks mainly to a first class committee headed by Donald Ross．I realize there must be one or two snags in a piping competition this size，but as a judge none were apparent to me．

The accoustics for pipes were very good in the small rooms， and also in the lage hall，but it was a different story with the band contest where we had drums and pipes clashing．I don＇t know what could be done about it，other than the use of a temporary carpet for the band competition．Having had the same problem when I played with the Powell River Pipe Band，and the use of a floor covering produced a much cleaner sound．

In conclusion I with to thank everyone who made my stay so welcome，and special thanks to Teresa and Willie MoErlean for their generous hospitality．
