

THIS IS A SUPPLEMENT TO THE DECEMBER NEWSLETTER.

Referring to page 3 of the newsletter; take notice that Articles 2 and 3 are not presented for discussion but are resolutions to be moved at the General Meeting at the Scottish Auditorium on January 8th, 1982.

ARTICLE 2

Include as a category of membership "Pipe Band Members".

ARTICLE 3

Add (f) to read as follows:

(f) A pipe band member consists of a band, whether incorporated as a distinct legal entity such as a Society or not, and whether sponsored by public or private funds or not at all, that is a identificable unit and that is actively engaged in the practice and promotion of the art and culture of Highland Bagpipe Bands. A pipe band member shall have the right to participate in the activities and affairs of the Association and to vote. It shall be entitled to one vote. It shall be intitled to hold office subject to the provisions of Article 19. A pipe band member shall appoint a delegate of its band and an alternate who will represent the pipe band at all meetings and events of the Association, and who shall be ready, willing and able to serve as a director if so elected.
