Playing in that drum Corp for the salute was Ron Annan, one of our local drummers who was on holiday in Scotland at the time. Ron as most of us know was a member of the Shotts & Dykehead band prior to coming to Canada.

The highlight for me as far as piping goes was attending the Northern Meeting at Inverness, 14th & 15th September, where I listened to some of the best piping I dever heard, and of course with Jack Lee winning two 1st's and a 3rd, our joy was hard to contain. (I say our, as there was quite a representation from the B. C. Pipers Socy. in evidence at the Gathering).


Chanter stock has knot hole inside. They are an old set of Henderson drones recently done up. An old, old Hardie chanter with the sole at a slight angle, also stolen at the same time was a white practice chanter.

Also when on the sad subject of stolen Pipes, this report strikes right at home. P.M. Hal Senyk had his Pipes stolen October 16th, from the trunk of his car, right after band practice around the Begbie School area, (East Hastings, Burnaby) description is as follows:

Old Set of Henderson Drones, around 1939 but look much older, due, I believe, to being banged around, in the 39-45 World War. They are of Silver and Ivory, with Silver thistle cap on top. Silver on drones are runic design. Chanter is Hardie - no sole, black cords, and no bag cover. The Pipes were in a large wooden case, with Leather Handle.

Reward for any information on whereabouts and recovery of these pipes.
