NOTE: Competitors must enter events on-line and pay by credit card at the CRHG website [Pipes and Drums Registration](#). No paper entries or cheques will be accepted.

Entries including tune names (only for Open snare drumming events and all band events) and full payment must be received by July 24, 2021 for entry to be accepted.

Competitors must read the "Tune Selection" section below for events where more than one tune or set is required to be submitted.

The Open grade is the highest calibre grade of the music discipline.

Adult Prep is a non-competition preparatory class for adult aged pipers who desire adjudicator's feedback on their development progress prior to eventually entering competitions in the Adult grade. Players are not permitted to play in the Adult Prep class events and the Adult grade events in the same competition

GENERAL INFORMATION

Step 1: Competitors must enter events on-line and pay by credit card at www.eventbrite.ca. No paper entries or cheques will be accepted. If you do not have a credit card, you may use a Visa® Gift Card purchased at any of the following locations. In Canada: Vancity credit unions, Shoppers Drug Mart, Pharmasave, 7-Eleven, and other retail outlets. In the USA: Wells Fargo, PNC Bank, US Bank, and other retail outlets.

Step 2: You should print this information document in order to read the information, music and rules requirements on both pages.

Step 3: You must complete all fields of the competitor information section online. Your BCPA Membership # is on your membership card.

Step 4: Where tune submissions are required in advance, (Open Snare Drumming, and Bands), tunes must be entered online or submitted to CRHG Secretary Phyllis Baikie pbaikie@shaw.ca before entry deadline of July 24, 2021.

Step 5: Before the entry deadline, updated band rosters must be submitted to the Membership Chair at membership@bcpipers.org

NON-MEMBER FEE

* **Solo competitors and bands who are not current members of the BC Pipers Association (BCPA) or an officially recognized piping/pipe band association affiliated with the BCPA (associations in the Alliance of North American Pipe Band Associations), must pay an additional \$12.00 CDN per soloist or \$60 CDN per band to entry fee total. Non-BCPA members, please submit a picture or scan of your current membership card, or similar proof, to pbaikie@shaw.ca**

VENUE

Nunns Creek Park, 1465 16 Ave, Campbell River,, BC.
Gates open at 8:30 am (Competitors) & 9 am (Public).

SCHEDULE

Solo competitions begin at 10:00 am. Pipe Band events begin approximately 2:30 pm. Awards Presentation and Closing Massed Bands are after the final band event (approximately 4:30 pm).

Depending on the number of entries, events may start earlier. All events subject to time change.

ADMISSION

No gate passes will be issued. Solo competitors gain entry with name on competitors list at gate. Band members gain entry with name on submitted band rosters at gate. The band player roster will be the one officially registered with the BCPA Membership Chair (membership@bcpipers.org) as of July 19, 2021. General admission is by donation.

Competitor numbers will be available at the Piping & Drumming Tent (Field 2 on south side of the Park).

RULES

Campbell River Highland Gathering events in solo piping, solo drumming, and pipe bands are conducted under the rules of the BC Pipers Association.

All bands are required to participate in the Closing Massed Bands to receive any monies offered by the Campbell River Highland Gathering events.

CHALLENGING UP

A band may play up one grade in one event for a selected competition without affecting their grading status, provided BCPA Competition Rules criteria is met. Prize money for only one grade will be awarded (whichever is highest).

ORDER OF PLAY

Orders of play for Open Piping, Snare, and Tenor Drumming, and Bands will be determined by random draw. The random draw will take place at 7 pm July 24 at the CRHG Competition Secretary's address. All other events are *first to enter, last to play*, however all "early bird" entries received by 11:59 pm July 16 will be considered to be randomly received on July 16.

All orders of play will be posted one week before the Festival in the Orders of Play section of the BC Pipers' Association web site (www.bcpipers.org) and at 8 am at the Competition Secretary's area on Games day.

Competitors not ready to play in the posted order may be disqualified.

TUNE SELECTION

For events where more than one tune or set is required to be submitted, tune selection for solo events will be conducted by the adjudicator at the time the competitor presents to perform, except for Open Snare Drumming events.

For Open Snare Drumming events, tunes and sets shall be submitted online or to pbaikie@shaw.ca by July 24, 2021. For Open Snare Drumming events, the selected set for each competitor in each event will be posted at the time the Games solo competitions start at the Competition Secretary's area.

If the Open Snare Drumming competitor does not submit their tunes or sets by the entry deadline, the competitor shall inform the adjudicator of the tunes or sets for the event at his/her scheduled competition time and the adjudicator shall indicate which tune or set is to be performed.

For band events, selection of MSR (Grades 1 & 2) will be conducted by Chief Steward when band is at the starting line.

PRIZES

For solo events other than Open, prizes are medals. For solo Open events, monetary prizes are awarded. For Open solo events, the total purse for Open Piping is over \$675, for Open Snare Drumming is over \$300, and for Open Tenor Drumming is over \$230.

Band events will be adjudicated. Due to lack of practice ability all bands will receive a performance payment. The amount will be dependent on the number of bands entering. Minimum payout will be \$300 per band.

WAIVER STATEMENT
